Main Idea: Truth Matters

Read Verse 29

1.) The practices of some, in Corinth, are inconsistent with their denial of the resurrection (v. 29)

A.) Historical Challenges with verse 29

i.) The NT is Silent on This Practice

iii.) No Parallel Practice of This in Any Other Pagan Religion At This Time

"This is a genuinely idiosyncratic historical phenomenon." –Gordon Fee

B.) Theological Challenges with verse 29

i.) This practice would contradict justification by grace through faith alone,

ii.) This practice would seem to involve a magical view of sacramentalism.

iii.) Paul simply states it and doesn't condemn it.

2.) Paul's Life is Absurd if There is No Resurrection. (v. 30-32)

i.) Paul was Not Your Typical Itinerant Preacher

"And when I came to you, brethren, I did not come with superiority of speech or of wisdom, proclaiming to you the testimony of God...**3** I was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling, **4** and my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom..."

1 Corinthians 2:1, 3-4

"**10** We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are prudent in Christ; we are weak, but you are strong; you are distinguished, but we are without honor. **11** To this present hour we are both hungry and thirsty, and are poorly clothed, and are roughly treated, and are homeless; **12** and we toil, working with our own hands; when we are reviled, we bless; when we are persecuted, we endure; **13** when we are slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become as the scum of the world, the dregs of all things, even until now."

1 Corinthians 4:10-13
