Various Texts

1.) Congregationalism- What it Means

Congregationalism- the last and final court of appeal in a matter of the life of a local church is the congregation itself

Four NT Examples of Congregationalism:

A.) In Matters of Disputes (Matthew 18:15-17; Acts 6:2-5; 1 Corinthians 6:4)

"Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. 16 But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.'

17 And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church. But if he refuses even to hear the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector. (Matthew 18:15-17)

"Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables. 3 Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; 4 but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

5 And the saying pleased the whole multitude..." (Acts 6:2-5)

"...do you appoint those who are least esteemed by the church to judge?: (1 Corinthians 6:4)

B.) In Matters of <u>Doctrine</u> (Galatians 1:8; 2 Timothy 4:3)

But even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed. (Galatians 1:8)

"will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers" (2 Timothy 4:3)

- D.) In Matters of Church Membership (2 Corinthians 2:6-8)

"This punishment which was inflicted by the majority is sufficient for such a man, 7 so that, on the contrary, you ought rather to forgive and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one be swallowed up with too much sorrow. 8 Therefore I urge you to reaffirm your love to him." (2 Corinthians 2:6-8)
