Three Lessons:

Joshua 14:12, 15, "...It may be that the Lord will be with me, and I shall be able to drive them out as the Lord said...Then the land had rest from war"

1 Samuel 14:6, "...it may be that the Lord will work for us. For nothing restrains the Lord from saving by many or by few."

1 Samuel 17:45-47, "You come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin. But I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. **46** This day the Lord will deliver you into my hand, and I will strike you and take your head from you. And this day I will give the carcasses of the camp of the Philistines to the birds of the air and the wild beasts of the earth, that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel. **47** Then all this assembly shall know that the Lord does not save with

sword and spear; for the battle is the Lord's, and He will give you into our hands."
