2 Samuel 5:1-16

_Read **2 Samuel 5:1-5**

Main Idea:

The Lord Exalts David's Kingdom for the Sake of his People

_Read **Verse 12**

1.) David Is Anointed King Over All of Israel (V. 1-5)

A.) They Are His Bone and Flesh

Judges 9:2, "...Remember that I am your own flesh and bone"

2 Samuel 2:26, "Then Abner called to Joab and said, "Shall the sword devour forever? Do you not know that it will be bitter in the latter end? How long will it be then until you tell the people to return from pursuing their brethren?"

B.) David Has Been Like a King to Them

2 Samuel 5:2, "Also, in time past, when Saul was king over us, you were the one who led Israel out and brought them in..."

C.) The Lord Said David Would Be King

2.) David Possesses the Gates of his Enemies (V. 6-10)

_Read **verses 6-10**

Joshua 14:12, "It may be that the Lord will be with me, and I shall be able to drive them out as the Lord said."

Joshua 15:63, As for the Jebusites, the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the children of Judah could not drive them out; but the Jebusites dwell with the children of Judah at Jerusalem to this day.

Judges 1:21, "But the children of Benjamin did not drive out the Jebusites who inhabited Jerusalem; so the Jebusites dwell with the children of Benjamin in Jerusalem to this day."

_Read **Verse 9**

John 3:16-18, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" **17** For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

2 Timothy 2:13, "If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself."

5.) David Is Not the One (V. 13-16)

Hebrews 12:25-29, "See that you do not refuse Him who speaks For if they did not escape who refused Him who spoke on earth, much more shall we not escape if we turn away from Him who speaks from heaven, **26** whose voice then shook the earth; but now He has promised, saying, "Yet once more I shake not only the earth, but also heaven." **27** Now this, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of those things that are being shaken, as of things that are made, that the things which cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us have grace, by which we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear. **29** For our God is a consuming fire."
