Main Idea:

David Is Blameless Before the Lord and the Lord Rewarded David According to his Righteousness

Psalm 51:5, "Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, And in sin my mother conceived me." (v. 5)

2.) David Is Asserting the Lord's Faithfulness (V. 26-31)

How Could David Claim to Be Free From Guilt?

"No one is righteous, no not one." (Rom 3:10)

Read 2 Samuel 22:1

I Kings 15:4-5

A.) No Righteousness

I Samuel 24:16-19.

B.) Perfect Righteousness

"...Do not remember the sins of my youth, nor my transgressions;" (Psalm 25:7)

C.) Imputed Righteousness

D.) <u>Covenantal</u> Righteousness

Romans 10:4-5, "**4** For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. **5** For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the law..."

Answer: David Has Been Faithful to the <u>Covenant</u> and my <u>Covenant</u> Lord Has Been Faithful to HIs Promise.

Read verse 23.

Luke I:6

Philippians 3:6, "...concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless."

The Old Covenant Neither Requires Perfect Obedience, Nor Offers Perfect Reward.

Application: Be Like David, Flawed but Faithful
